

**ATTENTION:  
NOTES from the CITY OF GREENE**

**Golf Cart & Side-by-side ATV**

Permits are required to operate Golf Carts and Side-by-side ATV's. County registration for these vehicles does NOT ALLOW operation inside of City limits. A permit is still required and can be obtained through City Hall with current proof of insurance for a fee of \$25/vehicle. Permits are only valid for the 2021 calendar year.

General Guidelines:

- You must be 18 years of age or older to operate these vehicles.
- No children are allowed on said vehicles at any time.
- Vehicles may only be operated from dawn until dusk each day.
- Several streets are off limits to golf carts and side-by-side ATVs. Traer Street (also known as Main Street) is one of them.
- A complete list of rules is available at City Hall.

**NOTE:** Those operating said vehicles without a permit and on roads specified as illegal for said vehicles will be issued a ticket by law enforcement and fined.

**Campers/RVs and Mobile Homes**

Campers, RVs and mobile homes are not meant to be stored on residential property. **ONE** camper *or* boat *or* RV may be in the driveway or backyard of a property however, occupants in said vehicles are not allowed. Property owners not adhering to this City Ordinance will be served a formal letter requiring abatement and fined \$150.

**Lawn Care & Property Maintenance**

- No grass on property should be over 6" in height.
- Overgrowth of shrubs, weeds, trees, and brush are not allowed within residential neighborhoods or business districts.
- Dilapidated structures are prohibited (i.e. broken windows, unfinished construction, holes in foundations or roofs, etc.)
- Junk vehicles – defined as vehicles with missing parts or those unable to be driven from the property- are illegal according to City Code. Additionally, no disassembled vehicles are allowed on residential property as well. Further, no junk items, discarded appliances, construction debris, etc. are to be left on property

Those property owners in violation of the above City Codes will be served a formal letter from the City requiring immediate action to be taken to remedy the nuisance. If not abated, the City will remedy the issue and the property owner will be responsible for the charges incurred. A lien may also be placed on the property.
